Douglas (Doug) Wayne Jumper, 63 years of age, passed on Friday, February 22, 2019 at St. David's South Austin Medical Center.

Doug was born April 14, 1955 in Dallas, Texas to the late Frank Jumper and Murnia Tharp, and was the eldest of five siblings. He married the love of his life, Korrina (Harris) Jumper, on March 24, 1979. They enjoyed life to the fullest in their 40 years of marriage, raising their daughter Sabrina (Jumper) Jordan and Frank Jumper to be strong, positive individuals. Doug was a very proud "pappaw" to his five grandchildren, Aubrey Jordan, Mabel Jumper, Adaline Jumper, Liam Douglas Jordan and Faye Jumper. He turned his yard into his grandkids' favorite destination, building a treehouse, playground and zipline by hand, and enjoyed watching them jump on the trampoline and playing in the pool.

Doug's first career was spent as an auto parts manager, but he spent the last 20 years of his career serving others as a handyman and running Jumper's Lawn Care & Handyman Service. He could fix or build anything, and worked faster than 10 young men put together. He cared more about helping others than making money, so hated sending invoices to his clients. Several of them became friends who complained that he wouldn't let them pay him. He especially had a big heart for senior citizens, for whom he did pro bono work even after he officially retired. Doug wasn't afraid of anything, and had a big adventurous spirit. His best friends joked that you should never follow him on a ski slope, or else you'll end up on a double black diamond. He loved the game of golf, and loved his golf buddies even more. Doug had a kind heart and welcomed everyone with a smile, which quickly turned strangers into friends.

He was the most positive man you'd ever meet, with an uncanny ability to go with the flow and let things roll off his back. While his family and friends are mourning his loss, they are finding comfort knowing that he didn't let his diagnosis slow him down over the past year, and that he was at peace as he said goodbye. He told his family that he 'knows where he's going, and isn't afraid to get there'. And for that, we can have joy even in the suffering.

Doug was preceded in death by his father, Frank Jumper and his brother Danny Jumper, and is survived by his wife, Korrina Jumper; his daughter, Sabrina Jordan; his son, Frank Jumper; his son in law, Jason Jordan; his grandkids, Aubrey Jordan, Mabel Jumper, Adaline Jumper, Liam Jordan and Faye Jumper; his mother, Murnia Tharp; his brothers David and Richard Jumper; his sister Donna Jumper; his nieces Ashle' Jumper Chupik, Madison Jumper and Courtney Gerspacher; his nephews Dustin Jumper, Josh Jumper and Raymond Osbourne; in addition to several friends and in-laws, who he loved.

Friends and family are invited to a Visitation/Viewing on Saturday, March 2 from 2-4pm at Harrell Funeral Homes in Kyle (1715 Kirby, Kyle, TX 78640). A memorial will be held at a later date, to be determined.
